- 2. In verses 28-29, Jesus offers a famous invitation to those who are weary and burdened. What does he mean by "my yoke is easy and my burden is light," and what does Jesus' promise to those who come to him?
- 3. In verse 29, Jesus describes himself as "gentle and humble in heart." What does this reveal about his character, and how does it apply to you?
- 4. What is an invitation of Jesus in today's passage that applies to you, and how can you share it with others?
