

- Congratulations to all who are celebrating December birthdays and anniversaries!

#### For our United Methodist Church

 We continue to pray for The United Methodist Church's journey through a time of significant change as we navigate new ways to live into that new reality.

#### For our community, nation, and world

- We send our love to the children who were shot at the Abundant Life Christian School in Madison, Wisconsin, and for the 15 year old shooter who took her own life.
   We pray for her family to be wrapped in love even in the midst of questions and anger. We pray for the school to experience love in the midst of their heartbreak and fear.
   We pray for the administrators to be able to navigate this tragedy with empathy and discernment.
- We pray that justice will be done and that mercy will be extended to those involved in an alleged Venezuelan gang-related kidnapping in Aurora, Colorado, U.S.A leading to 19 arrests. We pray that even in the midst of this injustice, ethnic minorities will not suffer from undue racism and hatred as a result.

- Our lips cry out in protest with those who escaped the firebombing of a synagogue in Melbourne, Australia.

- Prayers for the Ukrainian people, for protection and peace between Ukraine and Russia.

120th Anniversary Sunday Service and Potluck


