The Eaton Fire in Southern California destroyed the church building and many of the church members' homes burned to ashes. The consequences of the destructive Eaton Canyon fires are immeasurable.

The church was chartered in 1806 by the German Evangelical United Brethren denomination. After 1974 and the formation of the UMC, and later in 1980s Altadena UMC church merged with Lincoln Park United Methodist Church; a predominantly Black congregation that was located in Pasadena.
