For our United Methodist Church

 We continue to pray for The United Methodist Church's journey through a time of significant change as we navigate new ways to live into that new reality.

For our community, nation, and world

- Prayers for the people in the United States as last night, President Trump invoked the Alien Enemies Act of 1798 for the first time since World War II, granting himself sweeping powers under a centuries-old law to deport people associated with a Venezuelan gang. During World War II, with anti-foreigner fears sweeping the country, it was part of the legal rationale for mass incarceration in the United States of people of German, Italian and especially Japanese and Japanese American ancestry. An estimated 120,000 people with Japanese heritage, including those with U.S. citizenship, were incarcerated during the war. We pray for the protection of democratic freedom, for the safety of all citizens, and for leaders who uphold justice and equality for all.
- Prayers for our economy as we acknowledge the
 economic tremors shaking the global market. The
 imposition of tariffs, the delay of tariffs, has sparked fears
 of a trade war, affecting nations far and wide. We pray for
 economic stability, for wisdom among leaders to navigate
 these turbulent waters, and for the well-being of all who
 are affected by these changes.
- Prayers for South Korea, where the impeachment proceedings against Yoon Suk Yeol means a pause on the South Korean's president's effective foreign policy and further opportunity for North Korea's leader to increase his regime's nuclear capabilities. We pray for the country as they continue to face uncertainty and fear following the South Korean President's declaration of Martial Law on December 3, 2024.
- Prayers for President Volodymyr Oleksandrovych Zelenskyy, a brave person who is willing to sacrifice his career and power to save the Ukrainian people. We pray for the sovereignty and security of Ukraine, for the success of diplomatic efforts, and for the protection of all innocent lives caught in the turmoil. May the international community stand united in support of peace and justice.
- Prayers for the ongoing conflicts, uncertainty and strife in Israel and Palestine, and the ways that it has affected those living in the United States, such as Mahmoud Khalil – a recent graduate of Columbia University and a green card holder who was arrested by the Immigration and Customs Enforcement officers for participating in a protest against the Israel-Hamas War.
