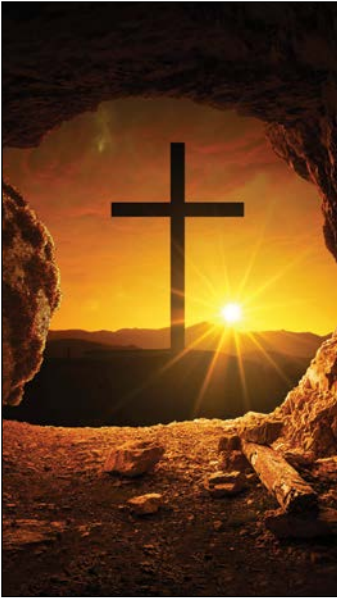
For our United Methodist Church

- We continue to pray for The United Methodist Church’s journey through a time of significant change as we navigate new ways to live into that new reality.

For our community, nation, and world

- Prayers of hope as we pray for all people affected by the earthquakes that have devastated areas of Myanmar, Thailand and China. Two back-to-back earthquakes struck Myanmar. The first earthquake had a magnitude of 7.7, centered around Sagaing City, the capital of the north western Sagaing region of Myanmar. We pray for the safety of people in the midst of natural disaster and war.
- Prayers of joy for Suni Williams and Butch Wilmore, the two American astronauts who returned safely to Earth after being stranded on the International Space Station for nine months.
- Prayers of joy as we rejoice with New York resident Sebastien Beauzile, the first patient ever cured of Sickle Cell Anemia.

- Prayers for people in the United States, where legal residents are being deported for being activists and fear that rights of free speech only apply to some, and we lift up all those who are unsafe in “peaceful” surroundings.
- Prayers for people in the United States as President Trump invoked the Alien Enemies Act of 1798 for the first time since World War II, granting himself sweeping powers under a centuries-old law to deport people associated with a Venezuelan gang. During World War II, with anti-foreigner fears sweeping the country, it was part of the legal rationale for mass incarceration in the United States of people of German, Italian and especially Japanese and Japanese American ancestry. An estimated 120,000 people with Japanese heritage, including those with U.S. citizenship, were incarcerated during the war. We pray for the protection of democratic freedom, for the safety of all citizens, and for leaders who uphold justice and equality for all.
- Prayers for peace in all areas of the world, and lift up Ukraine and Russia. We ask for God’s guidance, comfort, and protection for the people of Ukraine. We ask that there’s an end to the conflict. We pray for wisdom and compassion for world leaders.
- Prayers for the ongoing conflicts, uncertainty and strife in Israel and Palestine, and the ways that it has affected those living in the United States. As bloodshed resumes once again in Palestine, we continue to mourn and pray for your shalom in the holy land.
- Prayers for our economy as we acknowledge the economic tremors shaking the global market. The imposition of tariffs has sparked fears of a trade war, affecting nations far and wide. We pray for economic stability, for wisdom among leaders to navigate these turbulent waters, and for the well-being of all who are affected by these changes.

These flowers will be placed on the cross as you enter the Sanctuary for Easter worship.
