Tomorrow (5/26) Nisei Veterans Committee (NVC) and NVC Foundation presents: 80th Annual Memorial Day Service @ Lake View Cemetery Monday (5/26), 10:00am - 11:00am / Location: Lake View Cemetery, 1554 15th Avenue East, Seattle, WA

Each year, Blaine Memorial participates in the NVC Memorial Day service. This year, Rev. Karen will provide the Invocation and Bruce Yamamoto will provide the Christian Reflection. This will be the first year where Blaine Memorial UMC will present a wreath and George Yates will represent our church.

The Nisei Veterans Committee (NVC) holds a Memorial Day Service every year since 1946 to honor Japanese American and other veterans who gave their lives in service to our country. Over the years, it has become one of the oldest and largest Memorial Day services in the Northwest, with several hundred gathering by the Nisei War Memorial, a 22-foot-tall granite obelisk inscribed with the sites of major campaigns of WW II in Europe and the Pacific, as well as the names of Japanese American KIA (killed in action) from the Spanish-American War, WW I, WW II, the Korean Conflict, Vietnam, and Granada. This year bears special significance as we mark the 80th anniversary of the end of WWII.

Eighty years later, the Japanese American community and friends still gather to honor the Nisei veterans' service and loyalty to our country as we strive to continue their legacy of courage and sacrifice. We also honor those who gave their lives in subsequent wars and conflicts around the globe. Hope to see you at this special service tomorrow!
